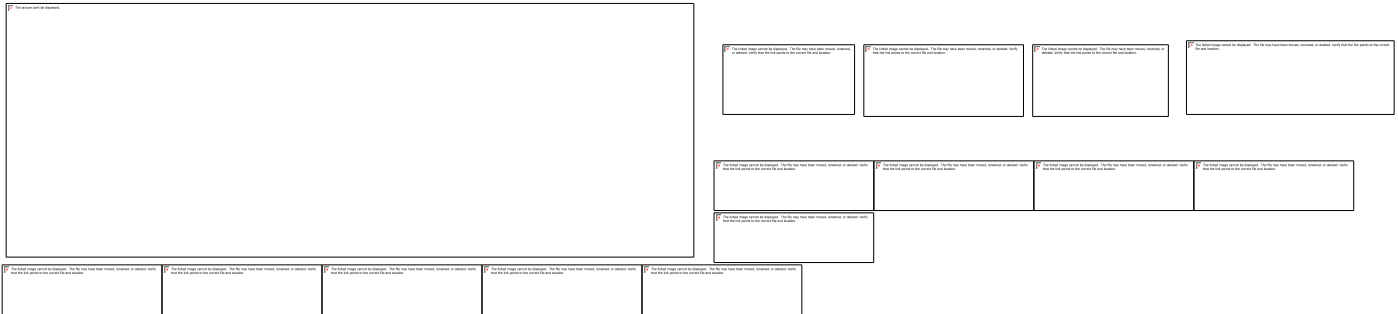

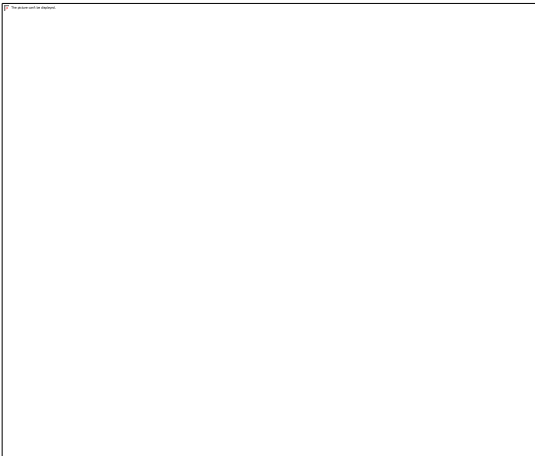

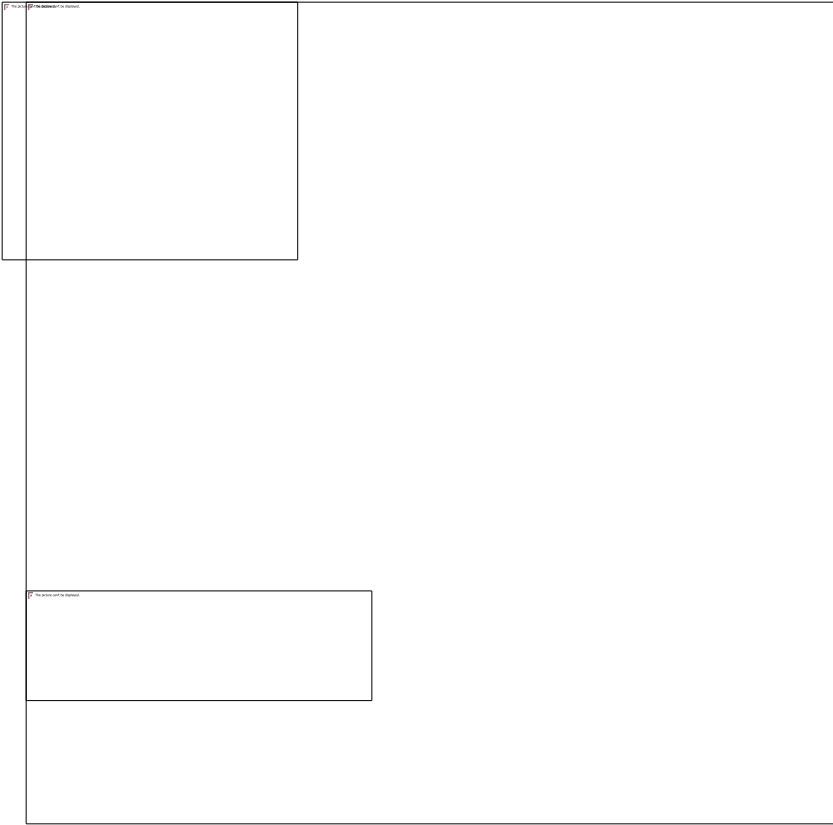

Abstract and representational artwork in all visual disciplines is on display in the gallery's 9,600 square feet, also designed by Szostak.

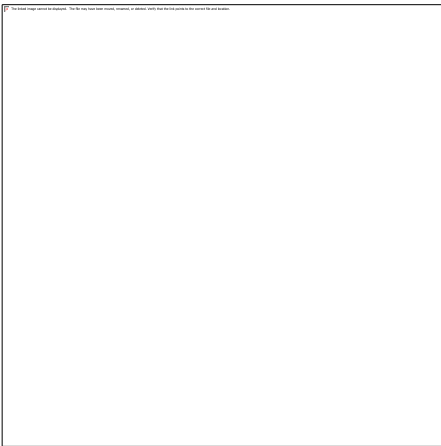
